Unmasked Work	During the course of the five week rehearsal period, School of Drama leadership has chosen to limit unmasked activities by specifically allocating 15 times where unmasked work can take place during the five week rehearsal period. Up to four (4) days per week may be unmasked. Every effort will be made to minimize the amount of unmasked time. Performers will take their mask off right before their scene and put it back on right after. All others in rehearsal during unmasked work must upgrade to a surgical mask. NIOSH approved N95 masks are available upon request. During unmasked work, all non-performer personnel in the rehearsal room will be at least 10' from the performers. All unmasked work is voluntary, students will have the final choice	The director, stage manager, and production manager will meet weekly to discuss upcoming unmasked rehearsals. Surgical masks will be provided by production management.
4. Vaccination attestation	on whether they want to remove their mask during rehearsals. Due to the unmasked nature of some rehearsals and performance activities, all performers will show their vaccine card/proof of vaccine to the School's Production Manager. The only info recorded will be a "yes" or "no". This process will follow University guidelines around verifying vaccinations for events. 5. Testing	All performers working unmasked will be tested weekly through the Husky Coronavirus Testing Program. The first test will take place with 72-hours of the first unmasked rehearsal and continue once weekly through the week following closing. 	 performer will not be able to rehearse unmasked until a test is provided. Students may walk up to testing if they're part of Husky Testing, or they can get tested in the E-4 parking lot through UW Medicine's walk up clinics. This test must be a RT PCR test, and results will be emailed to the School's Production Manager. 	
6. Food and Drink	A single serve coffee machine (Keurig), electric kettle with teabags will be provided in rehearsal. All personnel who would like to drink coffee and/or tea will need to supply their own mug that they are responsible for cleaning and storing. If someone wants to bring in snacks to share, they must be individually wrapped and the person brining in the snacks is responsible for cleanup at the end of rehearsal.
