ABOUT THE DIRECTOR

Brandon Ivie directs and develops new musicals and plays, most recently the world premiere of Justin Huertas's *Lizard Boy* at Seattle Repertory Theatre, *Jasper in Deadland* by Ryan Scott Oliver and Hunter Foster both Off-Broadway and at The 5th Avenue Theatre, *The Noteworthy Life of Howard Barnes* by Michael Kooman and Christopher Dimond at Village Theatre, and the musical web series "The Hinterlands" by Michelle Elliott and Danny Larsen. Broadway assisting: *First Date*, *A Christmas Story*, *Next to Normal*, and *Catch Me If You Can*. NYC: Lincoln Center Theater, The Public Theater/Joe's Pub, Signature Theatre, Prospect Theater Company, New York Musical Theatre Festival, 54 Below, NAMT, and more. Regional: The Kennedy Center, Paper Mill Playhouse, Signature Theatre, Ford's Theatre, and more. In his native Seattle, he is the artistic director of Contemporary Classics, directing/producing lauded Seattle premieres of *Next to Normal*, *The Last Five Years*, *The 25th Annual Putnam County Spelling Bee*, *A New Brain*, *john & jen*, *Zanna, Don't!*, the new musical *The Yellow Wood*, and is founder of the popular New Voices series. Drama League Directing Fellowship, SDCF Charles Abbott Fellowship, Lincoln Center Directors Lab, Drama League Artist-in-Residence. Training: University of Washington School of Drama where he was the Executive Director of the Undergraduate Theater Society.

ABOUT THE MUSICAL DIRECTOR

Jordyn Meeker is the owner and main teacher at EDGE Performing Arts & Dance. She also directs and musically directs around the greater Seattle Area. She holds a Bachelors of Music from Washington State University with a minor in Business Administration. While in school, Jordyn focused on vocal performing with classes in education and business. She has performed in such venues as Carnegie Hall and Avery Fischer Hall in New York City, and held lead rolls in shows such as *You're a Good Man, Charlie Brown*; *Baby, the Musical*; and *Jane Eyre*. Currently, Jordyn is a continuing voice student of Dr. Kari Ragan in Issaquah, Washington and sings for local bands and producers. Jordyn is a three time first place winner in the NATS Musical Theatre Competition and was a finalist in Washington-Idaho Young Artists Competition.

ABOUT THE WRITERS

William Finn (music/lyrics) is the writer and composer of *Falsettos*, for which he received two Tony Awards, Best Book of a Musical and Best Original Score. He has also written and composed *In Trousers*, *March of the Falsettos*, and *Falsettoland* (Outer Critics Circle Award for Best Musical, two Los Angeles Drama Critics Awards, two Drama Desk Awards, the Lucille Lortel Award, and Guggenheim Fellowship in Playwriting). Additional works include music and lyrics for *A New Brain* (Lincoln Center), *Elegies, A Song Cycle* (Lincoln Center), *Songs of Innocence and Experience* (Lincoln Center), *Romance in Hard Times* (The Public Theater, Barrington Stage) and *Little Miss Sunshine* (Second Stage). He teaches at the NYU Tisch Graduate Program in Musical Theatre Writing and is the Artistic Head of the Musical Theatre Lab at the Barrington Stage Company. He is a graduate of Williams College.

Rachel Sheinkin (book), a graduate of the Tisch School of the Arts at New York University, has written the book for a number of musical-theatre pieces, including *Little House on the Prairie*, with Donna DiNovelli and Rachel Portman, and *Sleeping Beauty Wakes*, on a commission from Deaf West, which earned her an LA Stage Ovation Award for a world-premiere musical. She received both the Tony and the Drama Desk Awards for Best Book of a Musical for *The 25th Annual Putnam County Spelling Bee*. Before writing for musicals, Rachel Sheinkin studied playwriting with Paula Vogel at Brown University and Yale School of Drama. She is on the adjunct faculty of the Tisch School's Musical Theatre Writing Program and a Lecturer in Playwriting at Yale School of Drama.

The Barrington Stage Company workshop of *THE 25TH ANNUAL PUTNAM COUNTY SPELLING BEE* was originally co-directed by Michael Barakiva and Rebecca Feldman.

The Farm was founded in 2007 by Rebecca Feldman, Artistic Director. It is a collective of writers and performers, including Jay Reiss, Dan Fogler, and Sarah Saltzberg. The Farm's interest is in the role of improvisation in creating new work for the theatre. The Farm initially designates a two-week intensive period in which to discover, develop, and rehearse a play from the impulses borne mainly out of the pressure of a deadline. Previous projects include *Super* (at Atlantic Theatre Studios), *Why I Hate Florida* (workshop at White Wave in DUMBO), and *C-R-E-P-U-S-C-U-L-E* (at the Present Company Theatorium in October 2002), on which *The 25th Annual Putnam County Spelling Bee* is based. The character and original dialogue of "Beth Marguiles," "Vice President Douglas Panch," "Mr. Barfee," and "Logainne Schwartzandgrunenierrie" were created by Rebecca Feldman, Jay Reiss, Dan Fogler, and Sarah Saltzberg, respectively.
